

Inatity Rams at Affordable Prices

It's hard to believe it's that time of year again! The late seasonal break and the extensive supplementary feeding through the extended dry has let the year slip away quickly. We experienced one of the driest starts to the season ever recorded, which significantly impacted our region in the Autumn. Pastures were slow to establish, and producers who lambed pre-July faced the challenge of needing to feed ewes through lambing.

July brought much-needed rainfall and a wetter than average month was very welcome across western Victoria. Although it wasn't instant relief to the "green drought" it certainly put some moisture back in the soil profile. A warm week in August certainly fired the grass into gear and the consistent rainfall has kept things ticking along nicely at present. Hopefully, the rain continues, allowing us the opportunity to replenish some hay and silage reserves.

Looking at the red meat outlook, the future appears very positive over the next few years. With global beef supplies tightening, fewer sheep in Western Australia, and a reduced lambing across much of southern Australia, well-finished lambs are expected to be in high demand. Some forecasters are predicting prices around \$8 /kg or better this coming season. Going forward into next year and beyond looks even better with lamb predicted to hit \$10 /kg by 2027.

Meat Eating Quality Trial

As part of our ongoing commitment to advancing and benchmarking our genetics, we entered two rams in an extensive meat-eating trial facilitated by Coopworth Genetics Australia, with support from MLA and the trial participants. The lambs were all managed commercially as a group and slaughtered in early Feb 2024. This trial provided a valuable benchmark for our two sires entered, both of which performed above average on most measured traits, including carcass weight. Remember that while as an industry we need to look at maintaining market share for our product, at the grass roots, lamb producer level - **weight still pays**.

Given the low prices offered last spring, we opted to take all our own commercial lambs to the next level. A testament to the quality of our breeding, our maternalbred wether lambs were well and truly among the top performers, with our total consignment sold over the hooks averaging just under 27kg CWT.

Sticking to our guns

Here at Chrome, we're dedicated to maintaining a balanced approach to our Maternal breeding program, balancing phenotype and genotype while continuing our aim of breeding uniform lines of ewes. There is no doubt there has been a percentage of ewes that are a bit on the larger side, and whilst we've been aware of push from some sectors of the industry to reduce the size of composite ewes, we are subtly putting selection pressure on the extremes. We support the reduction of excessively large frame score animals, but we're also being mindful that a moderate frame ewe that's fat will also be heavy. So, concentrating on doing ability and barrel on a moderate framed ewe is the key. This approach will produce easy-finishing, high-yielding lambs from these ewes. Remember, the ewe contributes half the genetics to terminal sired lambs.

Our MA ewes consistently scan in the 170 to 190 % range in normal years, which we believe is the sweet spot. Any higher, and the percentage of those harder-to-manage triplets becomes too high.

Chrome maternal clients regularly comment on how well the maternal wether lambs perform, whether on grass or in a feedlot.

Update on Our Chrome Shedders

It's been exciting to see the development of our new breed, the Chrome Shedders. This year we've welcomed our second generation of F1 shedders along with a new crop of F2 shedder lambs that are hitting the ground this Spring. We are keenly watching their progress as they develop and have tried various genetic lines to determine what best suits our goals.

Our Embryo Transfer shedder lambs contain a few elite F1's and several full-blood embryos, that look very impressive, exhibiting some great phenotypes. Our aim is to breed a sheep with stronger emphasis on carcass shape and constitution than the options currently available. This is crucial as we want our wether lambs to match or surpass our traditional Chromedale lambs in guality on the hook.

Of all the commercial shedder lambs sold last season we have not received any discounts in regard to price per kg received, a testament to their quality.

We have a limited number of F1 shedder 1 yo rams available for private selection upon request from mid-October, which will be displayed at our upcoming open day. Additionally, we expect to have a small number of our 2024 drop F2 shedding ram lambs available after Christmas.

In a nutshell, as beef prices rise, other red meats will follow the same trend.

This year, we're once again offering three terminal sire options for purchase, with similar numbers to last year. The Poll Dorset lineup features the first drop of rams available from the Warrawindi 21.0099, purchased at Adelaide Elite Ram Sale 2 years ago for \$19,000. His progeny is impressive, displaying plenty of growth and muscle, much like their sire.

The rams have come through a tough summer but will present well in early October.

The ICON Southies and ICON 25s continue to perform well for our clients aiming to market early finished lambs that are a bit shorter in the leg but have great carcass, or for those seeking an easy lambing terminal sire for ewe lambs. These lambs are particularly easy to get to 22-24 kg with minimal feed.
